# The Impact of Your Generosity

Because of you, 2024 has been a year of extraordinary achievements:

- Endowment Growth: We surpassed \$1.4 million!

- Low Expenses, High Impact: Administrative costs were only 1.5% of endowment value, allowing more funds to go directly to grants.
- **Community Support:** Nearly \$27,000 awarded in grants to local nonprofits whose programs strengthen our community.

Our 2024 Healthy Communities grant cycle supported diverse initiatives, from operational funding for local nonprofits to Thanksgiving meals, recycling programs, youth activities, and more. Here's just a glimpse of what we've accomplished together:

- Sunshine Station Child Care Center: \$2,500 for healthy foods.
- Upper Susitna Food Pantry: \$2,600 for Thanksgiving meals.
- Talkeetna Mobile Recycling: \$1,500 for sustainability efforts.
- **Denali Arts Council:** \$2,500 for operational support.

#### **More Than Just Grants**

Beyond funding, JSCF has fostered knowledge-sharing and connections:

- Hosted a free **Estate Planning Seminar** attended by 38 local residents.
